### PROGRAMMER-ANALYST (GIS) (Regular Full-Time)

The Finance Department - Information Technology Division requires a regular full-time Programmer-Analyst (GIS).

This is a highly technical and analytical position in which you will enter and maintain spatial/attribute data using ESRI ArcGIS software, Hansen asset management tools, and other business systems; complete user requests for GIS maps, statistical reports and spatial analysis; assist in the definition of user needs and the implementation of new and/or revised systems; participate in analyzing existing and proposed systems, procedures, and requirements; prepare program design specifications, write, configure, modify, and test application programs; advise on technical solutions for GIS system improvements and troubleshooting; provide end user support and training assistance.

You will have completed courses in GIS applications and theory leading to or resulting in a Diploma/Degree, preferably in GIS, and possess at least 3 years related experience with ESRI toolsets. A working knowledge of ESRI's ArcMap, ArcCatalog, ArcToolbox; relational databases; and programming languages such as Python or Microsoft Visual Basic, together with an in-depth cartographic proficiency and strong SQL language skills are required. Experience working with ArcSDE geodatabases, AutoCAD, ArcObjects, ArcGIS Server or ArcIMS, FME, and Hansen would be definite assets.
