Hurricane Sandy

- Killed at least 286 people in seven countries
- Second costliest storm in US history: \$68 billion in damages
- Largest Atlantic hurricane on record
- Directly hit NYC
- Highest storm-surge every recorded in NYC



















Mounting Storm

- Oct 23: Develops into Cat 1 hurricane
- Oct 24: Strikes Kingston, Jamaica
- Oct 25: Hits Cuba & Haiti
- Oct 26 28: Developing in Atlantic
 - Communities declare states of emergency
 - NYC prepares for disaster on epic scale







Impact on NYC

- Massive storm surge floods city
- Power outages affect millions
- Fires destroy hundreds of homes
- Evacuate inundation zones
- Help citizens shelter, food, water, and medical services
